1. Sheep

2. Rooster

4. Cow A cow has one big stomach with four parts, and she brings her grass back up to chew it again.

5. Pig Pigs can barely sweat, so a mud bath is how they keep cool, and it works as sunscreen too.

6. Duck Ducks spread oil from a gland near their tail over their feathers, which makes them waterproof.

7. Donkey A donkey's coat isn't waterproof like a horse's, so donkeys need a roof when it rains.

8. Turkey The bare skin on a turkey's head changes color when it is excited or calm.

9. Goose Geese are so loud and brave that farmers have kept them as guards for thousands of years.

10. Llama Llamas spit mostly at other llamas, not at people. Some llamas even work as guards for sheep!

11. Cat A slow blink is a cat's smile. Slow-blink at a cat, and it will often blink back.

12. Dog Every dog's nose print is different, just like your fingerprint.

13. Goldfish Fish have no eyelids; the water keeps their eyes clean and wet.

14. Bunny (a rabbit) A rabbit's teeth never stop growing, so it needs hay to wear them down. The happy jump really is called a binky.

15. Hamster Hamsters have stretchy cheek pouches that reach back to their shoulders.

16. Fox Foxes hear mice moving under the snow and pounce on them nose first. The golf balls come from the fun facts in our book Forest Animals.

17. Owl Owls cannot move their eyes, so they turn their heads instead, up to three quarters of the way around.

18. Bear Bears eat mostly berries, nuts, roots and insects, and a mother bear has her tiny cubs in the winter den while she sleeps.

19. Deer A male deer grows new antlers every year and drops them every winter.

20. Wolf As the fun fact in our book Forest Animals says, wolves don't howl at the moon, but they howl more on bright nights.

21. Squirrel Squirrels forget many of the nuts they bury, and those nuts grow into new trees.

22. Hedgehog A hedgehog has thousands of spines. When it smells something new, it licks foam onto them, and scientists still don't know why!

23. Woodpecker When it's tucked away, a woodpecker's tongue wraps all the way around the back of its skull.

24. Raccoon Raccoons have very sensitive front paws that work almost like hands.

25. Skunk Before it sprays, a skunk stamps its feet and raises its tail to warn you.

26. Tyrannosaurus rex T. rex had about 60 teeth, and the biggest were up to 20 cm (8 inches) long, about the size of a banana.

27. Triceratops "Triceratops" means "three horned face". The egg chase is Spike's story in Dinosaurs Are Back.

28. Stegosaurus The tail spikes even have a nickname: the thagomizer.

29. Brachiosaurus Its name means "arm lizard", because its front legs were longer than its back legs. From Dinosaurs Are Back: it ate 100 to 400 kilograms of plants every day.

30. Velociraptor From Dinosaurs Are Back: small like a big turkey, but it could run up to 65 km (40 miles) per hour.

31. Ankylosaurus From Dinosaurs Are Back: armored like a knight and as powerful as a tank, with a club on its tail.

32. Spinosaurus From Dinosaurs Are Back: it grew up to 15 meters (49 feet) long, even bigger than T. rex.

33. Dilophosaurus From Dinosaurs Are Back: some people think it was poisonous, but there's no evidence for that. Its name means "two-crested lizard".

34. Apatosaurus From Dinosaurs Are Back: it grew up to 23 meters (75 feet) long, and Brontosaurus is a different dinosaur.

35. Carnotaurus Its name means "meat-eating bull". From Dinosaurs Are Back: it was one of the fastest dinosaurs, with remarkably short arms.

36. Pteranodon Surprise: Pteranodon was not a dinosaur. It was a pterosaur, a flying reptile that lived at the same time. Its name means "wing without tooth".

37. Whale (the blue whale) The blue whale is the biggest animal that has ever lived, and it eats tiny shrimp called krill.

38. Shark Some sharks go through thousands of teeth in a lifetime.

39. Crab A crab's legs bend sideways, so walking sideways is the quickest way to go.

40. Penguin Penguins "fly" underwater, using their wings like flippers.

41. Octopus Octopuses really have three hearts and blue blood.

42. Dolphin Dolphins rest one half of their brain at a time, so they can keep swimming up for air.

43. Sea star (many people call it a starfish) Sea stars can grow back lost arms, and they are not fish at all.

44. Seahorse In seahorse families, the dad carries the eggs until the babies hatch.

45. Sea turtle Mother sea turtles swim back to the beach where they hatched to lay their own eggs.

46. Jellyfish Jellyfish have lived in the oceans for more than 500 million years, long before the dinosaurs.

47. Elephant Baby elephants suck their trunks for comfort, the way children suck their thumbs.

48. Giraffe A giraffe's tongue is up to 50 cm (20 inches) long, and scientists have recorded giraffes humming at night.

49. Zebra Every zebra's stripes are different, like a fingerprint.

50. Lion Lions are the only cats that live in families, called prides, on the African savanna (not in the jungle!). A lion's roar carries about 8 km (5 miles).

51. Tiger Tigers live in Asia and love to swim. Their skin is striped too, not just their fur.

52. Monkey Grooming keeps monkeys clean, and it's how they make and keep friends.

53. Sloth Green algae grow in a sloth's fur and help it hide. It climbs down only about once a week, to poo. And it isn't lazy: leaves just give it very little energy.

54. Parrot Pet parrots can learn to copy words. And parrots have a favorite foot, just like you have a favorite hand!

55. Crocodile A crocodile's pointy snout shows its teeth even when its mouth is shut; an alligator's rounder snout hides them. And a mother crocodile carries her babies to the water, gently, in her mouth.

56. Hippo (a hippopotamus) Hippopotamus means "river horse". Hippos can't swim or float: they walk and bounce along the river bottom. Their red "sweat" is a sunscreen.

57. Ladybug One ladybug can eat thousands of aphids, the little bugs that hurt plants.

58. Butterfly Butterflies have taste sensors on their feet.

59. Ant Ants can carry things much heavier than themselves, and the ants you see marching are almost all sisters.

60. Spider Spiders have eight legs, so they are arachnids, not insects.

61. Snail In dry weather, snails seal themselves inside their shells and sleep until it rains.

62. Bee Honeybees do a "waggle dance" to tell the hive where the flowers are.

63. Firefly Fireflies are beetles, and they flash their lights to find each other.
