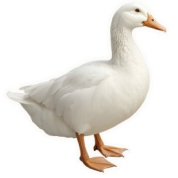


8 ways to play animal riddles



1 **Guess the animal bag.**

Put toy animals in a bag. Read a riddle; whoever guesses pulls it out.

2 **Riddle of the day.**

One riddle at breakfast. The answer comes at dinner.

3 **Lunchbox note.**

A folded card in the lunchbox. They open the fold at school.

4 **Car rides.**

One clue per mile. No screens needed.

5 **Bedtime.**

Five riddles, lights low, whisper the sounds.

6 **Circle time (for teachers).**

Hand out picture cards. The child holding the answer stands up.

7 **Riddle hunt.**

Each answer tells you where the next card is hiding (under the cat, next to the goldfish).

8 **Act it out.**

Instead of saying the answer, they have to BE the animal.

For little ones (3 to 4): start with clue 2, the easy one, show the shadow, and cheer every guess.

For big kids (5 to 8): clue 1 only. Can they get it without the second one?
